AIMM 2025: ATTRACT, INCLUDE, MATURE AND MOBILIZE

One of our top priorities is growing our membership. The Board and Staff will be working on ideation and implementation of this priority, engaging our current constituency in the process.

One approach to consider is "AIMM 2025" a three-year-initiative that includes the following touchpoints:

ATTRACT: MCCDC must attract new people if we are to grow our membership. With the upcoming Sanctuary Renovation Project and the expansion of our online capacities, we will focus on how we present ourselves to the broader community, locally and globally. While it is important that our physical and online presence convey our welcome and our accessibility, it is also important to engage our congregation in attracting people. Our videos on TikTok and YouTube are high quality. Yet the impact will be limited unless these videos are "shared" and "liked."

INCLUDE: After attraction, the next step is inclusion. This includes intentional development on what happens after people attend in person or online. In addition to acknowledging their initial presence of new friends, next steps include invitations to further engagement, learning about their needs, and also learning about the gifts they are willing to share.

MATURE: We are called to grow numerically, and also spiritually. Church health is important as church growth. It is important that we create programming to increase biblical literacy, theological development, and practical application of spiritual practices. Also key is continued attention to healthy communication and leadership covenants.

MOBILIZE: MCCDC has what the world needs. Now it is time to put our message into action. It is important that the various gifts of our communities be identified and then for each person to find their place in sharing it. Some may be called to more internally focused actions such as hospitality, intercessory prayer, and internal pastoral care, including Barnabas Culture Ministries. Others will be called to more externally focused actions such as our involvement in Pride, justice events, public gatherings, community service, the Komen Race for the Cure, The Walk to End HIV and neighborhood commissions. As we mobilize, our message of healing and wholeness will expand for God and for Good.

TRY ON NEW IDEAS, EVEN THOSE THAT INITIALLY BRING UP FEELINGS OF REJECTION OUT OF HAND

IT'S OK TO DISAGREE (WITHOUT BEING DISAGREEABLE)

IT'S NOT OK TO SHAME, BLAME, AND ATTACK SELF OR OTHERS

USE "I" LANGUAGE TO AVOID UNIVERSALIZING OR ASSUMPTIONS

PRACTICE BOTH/AND THINKING; TRY REPLACING "BUT" WITH "AND"

BE HERE NOW: LISTEN

DO NOT INTERRUPT

INVITE QUESTIONS

TRY NOT TO GET FOCUSED ON WHAT YOU'RE GOING TO SAY NEXT

BE AWARE OF INTENT AND IMPACT

ASK CLARIFYING QUESTIONS (In a non-threatening or accusatory tone)

RECEIVE QUESTIONS AS CURIOSITY NOT ATTACK

KEEP CONVERSATIONS IN THE ROOM; OUR STORIES ARE OURS TO SHARE

BE SELF AWARE OF BODY LANGUAGE AND FACIAL EXPRESSIONS
