The same is true for all of us. We're only around for a little while. I think often of all the people of faith who were Church in all its various flavors before all of us came along. I wonder what it was like to be in their shoes, what they thought about the future, whether or not they could possibly imagine the Church of today. And I think about those who will follow us in the faith.

Choices we make today are built on those who have gone before. And what we do—or don't do—will reverberate for generations.
