Commitment

"Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she, out of her poverty, has put in everything she had, all she had to live on." ~Mark 12:43b-44

The story in Mark's gospel about the widow woman and her two little copper coins teaches us the difference between a contribution and a commitment. She need not fear making a real commitment. She was unafraid of giving away even her last penny, for you see, she had learned well the lesson: No one ever becomes poor by giving. So she gave it all.

We are not asked to give it all, dear Friends, but we are asked to give. What a rich opportunity to insure that the message of God's love continues to be shared with the world around us and with the world on the far side of the Earth.
