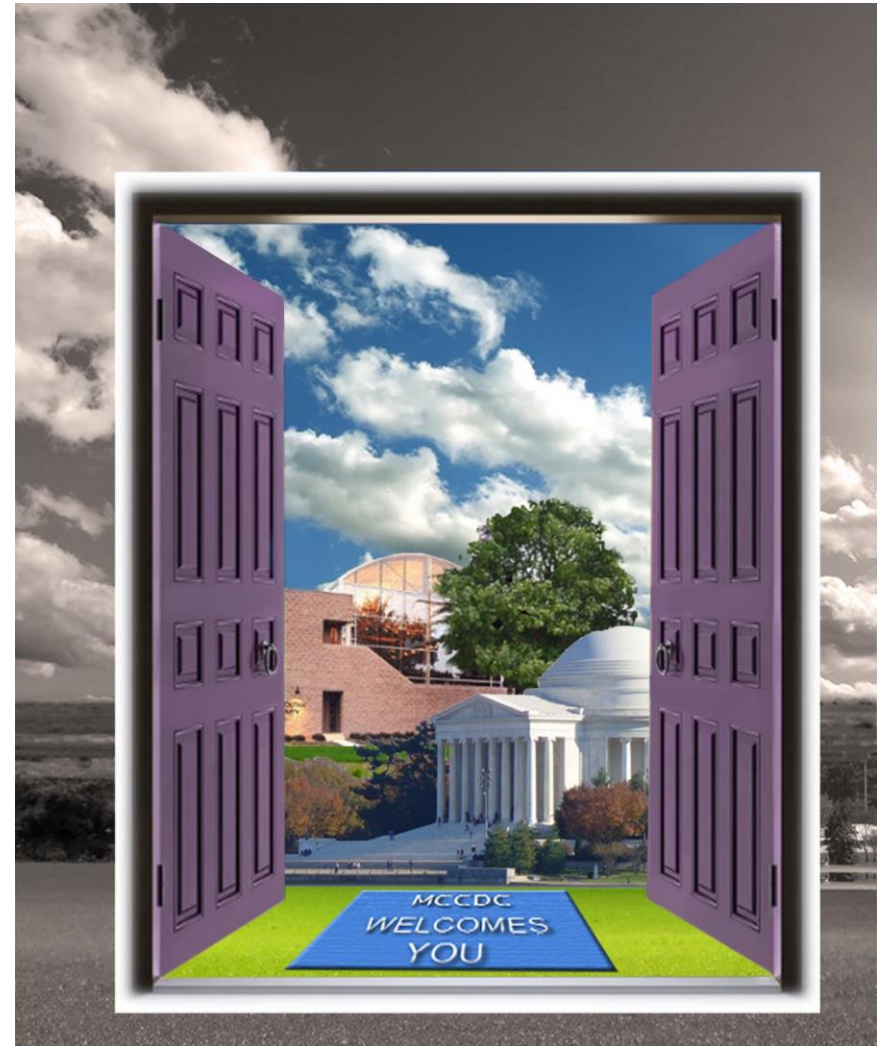

Rev. Elder J. Dwayne Johnson, Senior Pastor

Pastor Dwayne was elected as the Senior Pastor at our November 2009 Congregational Meeting. He began his pastorate on January 1, 2010. Rev. Johnson has a passion for outreach, justice and equality that is grounded in spiritual development. In 2006 he participated in a peace mission to Israel with a group of Jewish, Muslim and Christian educators and clergy. In January 2009 he became a member of the Academy for Spiritual Formation, studying with Grace Imathiu, Margaret Guenther, Glenn Hinson and other leaders in the Spiritual Formation movement.

Dwayne's history toward Pastoral Ministry in MCC began in the late 1980s when he served as a Volunteer Pastoral Assistant under Rev. Larry Uhrig, who was Senior Pastor at MCCDC at the time. He transferred his clergy credentials from the Church of the Nazarene to MCC and subsequently began his first MCC Pastorate in Richmond, Virginia in 1992. From 1996 through 2009, Rev. Johnson was Senior Pastor of Resurrection MCC in Houston, Texas. During his service, the congregation grew from approximately 300 to over 600 members, moved to a 10-acre campus, and recovered from massive hurricane damage to the church facility.

Born in Lubbock, Texas, he has also lived in California, Kansas, Missouri, and Washington State. He is a graduate of Mid-America Nazarene University in Olathe, Kansas, majoring in Communications, Psychology and English and earned his M.Div. from Nazarene Theological Seminary in Kansas City, Missouri.

Rev. Cathy Alexander, Associate Pastor

Rev. Cathy was born and raised in Williamsburg VA and has been active in Metropolitan Community Churches since 1999. As Associate Pastor she is responsible for development and coordination of spiritual and affinity based programming to assist people in connecting and engaging in the life of the MCCDC. She is also responsible for coordinating volunteer engagement programs and would enjoy speaking with you about your spiritual giftedness and your passions for ministry.

Rev. Cathy is a retired military officer and a graduate of Wesley Theological Seminary where she earned her M.Div. She has also held memberships and ministry or staff responsibilities at MCC of the Spirit (Harrisburg, PA), MCC of Northern Virginia (MCCNOVA in Fairfax, VA) and duties at the MCC denominational level (People of African Descent Conference Planning Team, MCC Governing Board Nominating Committee and MCC Judiciary Committee).

Who We Are

The Metropolitan Community Church of Washington DC (MCCDC) is a Christian Church with a special ministry to Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer people. As our vision statement proclaims, we seek to "Affirm God's Love, Share Christ's Message and Serve in the Spirit." This year we celebrate our 48th anniversary. As a member congregation of Metropolitan Community Churches, we proclaim God's love for all persons, participate in a ministry of social justice, and advocate the human rights of all persons. Our authority for ministry comes from God and is revealed through Christ and the Scriptures as God's inspired word.

Communion

The Sacrament of Holy Communion is offered to ALL who seek God's love. Membership in this church (or any other church) is not a requirement to receive this gift. It is our custom to dip the wafer into the cup of juice and offer it with a personal prayer for God's blessing. Also, Communion with silent prayer is served at the far left side near the piano.

Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is offered during Sunday worship to all who request it. Baptism by water and the Spirit, according to the Scriptures, is a sign of the dedication of each life to God and God's service. Through the words and acts of this sacrament, you are identified as God's own Beloved.

Our Response to the Word

During the Hymn of Response, we encourage you to come forward for prayer for yourself or for someone you may be carrying in your heart. The person leading this portion of the service will ask what your particular concern might be and then a prayer will be offered that incorporates all of the concerns brought forward. Also, this is the time in the service where, if you wish to be baptized, you may come forward and express that desire to the person leading prayer.
